

Potential Economic and Fiscal Impact of Loan & Grant Programs Colorado Springs, Colorado June 1, 2020

Summit Economics, LLC was retained by the City of Colorado Springs to estimate the economic and fiscal impacts to Colorado Springs and El Paso County that might result from soft loans and grants made with local businesses and non-profit organizations (collectively referred to as establishments) that have either shut down or are at serious risk of laying off employees and closing the establishment as a result of the Covid19 pandemic. The following outlines the potential impacts from loans and grants made through May 28, 2020 by Survive and Thrive, the Pikes Peak Community Foundation, the Downtown Development Authority, and El Paso County.

Combined, \$5,432,304 in loans and grants were made to 422 local businesses and non-profit organizations directly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The analysis indicates that the loans could potentially save 5,863 direct jobs and 7,965 total jobs, and prevent the loss of \$757,573,374 in annual economic output while preserving \$5,497,893 in local sales tax revenue each year.
